Haida Gwaii has gone, and continues to go through, monumental change. Working on these changes since 2005, the District, in concert with the Council of the Haida Nation, has worked to both develop and implement some very innovative solutions within the portfolios of consultation, C&E, tenures, authorizations, stewardship, Protected Area Management and Decision Making, clearly pointing the way toward “Two Governments-One Team”.
