The Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development has a mandate to manage specified Crown land and resources in a manner that embraces the economic, environmental and social goals of government. These results are all essential to improving the global competitiveness of BC industry and our ability to attract private investment and to stimulate economic growth and job creation across the province.

As an Engineering Officer, you will be focused on managing all aspects of the engineering program within the 100 Mile House Natural Resource District. This will include bridges, surveys, resource roads and road design. You will also lead budgets, contracts, staff, stakeholder consultation, certification, and all resource road user safety.

Qualifications for this role include:

- A degree or diploma in a natural resource field (i.e., forestry) or civil engineering (i.e., chemical, metallurgical, forest engineering, survey geomatics, geoscience) and 2 years of recent (gained within the last 5 years) experience in road, bridge and/or major structures design, construction and/or maintenance. An equivalent combination of education and experience may be considered.
- Registered Forest Technician (RFT), or immediately eligible for registration as an RFT, with the ABCFP. **Note:** Immediately eligible is defined as being currently registered as a fully licensed professional in good standing in an applicable jurisdiction and can immediately transfer to the ABCFP as an RFT. Applicants who do not meet the professional requirement may be considered at a lower classification, subject to confirmation of eligibility for registration as a Trainee-Forest-Technologist with the ABCFP immediately upon employment with the Ministry and can attain RFT status within two years of employment. If applicable, applicants must contact the ABCFP to confirm their eligibility.
- Experience in contract and/or project supervision.
