BC Timber Sales (BCTS) manages about 20 per cent of the province's allowable annual cut for Crown timber, generating economic prosperity for British Columbians through the safe, sustainable development and auction of Crown timber. BCTS operates in 33 communities and directly supports over 8,000 jobs across B.C.

BCTS also supports government's commitment to true, lasting reconciliation with First Nations in BC as we move toward fully adopting and implementing the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples and the Calls to Action of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission.

As the Woodlands Manager, you will identify the necessary resources for the achievement of operational objectives, and issues, and administer Timber Sales Licenses. You will also manage and monitor operations until free growing state is reached. Additional responsibilities will include implementing forestry and business practices reflective of the private sector to provide benchmark information for provincial timber pricing. You will ensure resource management practices are performed and evaluated in accordance with operational and higher-level land use plans, legislative requirements and forestry certification standards.

### **Qualifications for this role include:**

- At least five years of program and related forestry experience and a university degree or diploma in a field related to forestry or resource management or a forestry related professional designation (e.g., RPF, RFT).
- Experience developing, managing and delivering resource management programs.
- Experience in program administration including allocating resources, leading and coaching diverse teams, supervising staff, and strategic business planning, procurement and financial management.
- Must possess at minimum a valid Class 5 B.C. Driver's License that does not limit or restrict the ability to conduct the duties of the job.
